much fun. There was great feedback from the parents too and they were all eager to know when it will be organized again this year. We intend to plan another set this year.

Sam left the United States for Guinea on Jan 19th, 2017. He intends to stay in Guinea for a year to manage the affairs at Home of Hope Orphanage and oversee the construction of the additional rooms and office space there. We encourage you all to keep him in your prayers. We are also very thankful that we have a volunteer, Jasmine Jacquay, going to join him there for six months. Jasmine has a

lot of experience working with refugees and children and will be a great help teaching and

caring for the children at Home of Hope. She plans to plant a garden at Home of Hope with vegetables, together with Sam's help. Exciting news indeed!

The children are doing well in school and Sam will be working on getting their formal names registered and finalized. Before, the children had only nicknames and unofficial names which they were called while growing up at the camp. We are also working to put together a "Sponsor A Kid" program where our supporters can sponsor one child either monthly or yearly. Each child can have more than one sponsor. The sponsor will then have personal updates of the child and follow his or her progress. We are really excited to implement this and will keep you updated once its fully set up on our website.

Through the fundraising activities we had this year and generous donations, we have raised enough funds to begin construction work on the two bedrooms and office space needed at Home of Hope; this places us in compliance with the stipulations from the Guinean government. We also have funds to cover the monthly expenses of the children until May 2017. We hope for your ongoing support as we continue to raise funds to cover the care of the children for the remaining months of the year. It is through your support that we have been able to implement our mission and give opportunities to former refugees and orphans to realize their full potential through education, love, and care. We thank you for that, and appreciate you all so much. We keep praising the Lord for how far he has brought us and for his goodness towards us.
